

RESOLUTION NO. 24-20

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH OTHER ENTITIES CURRENTLY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ALPINE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE CREATION OF A NEW SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Alpine School District (the “District”) is currently considering splitting the District and creating one or more new school districts;

WHEREAS, a feasibility study was conducted by MGT Education;

WHEREAS, Draper City desires to cooperate with other entities currently within the boundaries of the District to obtain voter approval for the creation of a new school district;

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2024, the City Council held a duly noticed public meeting to ascertain the facts regarding this matter, which facts and comments are found in the meeting record; and,

WHEREAS, after considering the facts and comments presented to the City Council, the Council finds: (i) that Draper City should enter into an interlocal agreement with other entities in the Alpine School District for the creation of a new school district; and ii) such action furthers the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Draper.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of Draper City:

1. The interlocal agreement attached hereto as Exhibit “A” is hereby approved and the Mayor is directed to take any and all action necessary to make it effective, including but not limited to, signing the notice to the Utah County Clerk initiating the process to create a new school district attached hereto as Exhibit “B”.

2. The City Attorney is authorized to correct any punctuation, spelling, formatting, or similar errors and to make non-substantive changes to conform the interlocal agreement with the version approved by the other Parties thereto.

3. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
